^{vi} Protected classifications under California law are race; color; religion (includes religious dress and grooming practices); sex/gender (includes pregnancy, childbirth, breastfeeding, and/or related medical conditions); gender identity, gender expression; sexual orientation; marital status; medical condition (genetic characteristics, cancer or a record or history of cancer); military or veteran status; national origin (includes language use and possession of a driver's license issued to persons unable to provide their presence in the United States is authorized under federal law); ancestry; disability (mental and physical including HIV/AIDS, cancer, and genetic characteristics); genetic information; request for family care leave; request for leave for an employee's own serious health condition; request for Pregnancy Disability Leave; retaliation for reporting patient abuse in tax-supported institutions; age (over 40).
